The host pastor, Scott Blair and his wife Kelly graciously invited me to the conference and housed me in their lovely prophets' chamber for the weekend. The event was the effort to honor the Lord's servants, Dr. and Mrs. Harold Davidson, as he celebrated

his ninetieth birthday. The Davidsons have been used of God to bless His saints spiritually and materially through

the years, and especially Bible Baptist Church and Bible Baptist Theological Seminary. The Davidsons were members of Bible Baptist Church in Cromwell, CT, starting in 2009 and remaining until 2013, when, as octogenarians, they were commissioned and sent out to start Bible Baptist Church in Cody, WY.

Not only was my visit a surprise to them, but Dr. Davidson's daughter Gina and granddaughter Lynn surprised them with their visit for the weekend. Dr. Davidson has been involved in the lives of many seminarians over the last eleven years as the seminary chaplain, some of whom were present for the conference, including Pastor Scott Blair, Dr. Keith Main, Pastor Stephen Hinebaugh, and BBTS Professor Jeff Skorupski. It has been a privilege for me to have been the Davidson's pastor, to have walked shoulder to shoulder with them through some theological battles, and to have rejoiced



with them over biblical blessings. May the celebrating his 90th birthday Lord continue to bless Harold and Edith Davidson, servants of the Lord.

### FALL LECTURE SERIES

Five hundred years ago, Oct. 31, 1517, the Roman Catholic Church (RCC) monk Martin Luther posted 95 arguments against the doctrine of indulgences on the Wittenberg Church door and initiated the Protestant Reformation. The reformers were baptized members of the RCC who protested the Pope's encroachment on their respective territories. RCC Leaders in Germany backed Luther while the RCC member Henry the VIII rejected the papal influence in England. Luther was excommunicated out of the visible RCC in 1521 and began the Lutheran Church in 1530. The RCC member Huldrych Zwingli preached reform in 1525 in Zurich, Switzerland. By 1534 Henry VIII decreed the existence of the Church

of England. Later RCC member John Calvin controlled Geneva Switzerland with his "reformed theology" (1541). The RCC reformers continued the RCC ecclesiology of the sacral society, maintaining the manta "whose territory his religion." They demanded by physical force the necessity of a national religious leader, religious sacraments which made one right with sacral society, and death to dissidents. The Baptists, of course, rejected the sacral society and practiced believers' immersion into visible assemblies. Because Baptists differed with the RCC and with Protestants on the nature

of the ecclesia and therefore the mode and meaning of baptism, the former were severely persecuted during the Reformation era by both movements. The entrance into the visible assembly was through profession of faith and water immersion for the Baptists, whereas the RCC and Protestants taught that infants were regenerated in baptism and permitted membership into the state religion. For instance, Luther defended the articles of the authoritative Lutheran Augsburg Confession (1530), including



Pastor Thomas Strouse will speak on "The Baptists and the Reformation" the following: "Article IX: Of Baptism. 1) Of Baptism they [Lutheran churches] teach that it is necessary 2) to salvation, and that through Baptism is offered the grace of God, and that children are to be baptized who, being offered to God through Baptism are received into God's

grace. 3) They condemn the Anabaptists, who reject the baptism of children, and say that children are saved without Baptism." The initial Reformers (Luther, Zwingli, Calvin, Henry VIII) were exactly that—as Catholics they attempted to reform the RCC! There is no unambiguous evidence that they were born-again Christians, but to the contrary their own statements revealed that they promoted baptismal regeneration. The Baptists of that era resisted this reformed RCC sacral religion and guite often it cost these Biblicists dearly. The Bible Baptist Theological Seminary 2017 Fall Lecture Series will present "The Baptists and



the Reformation" lecture (Dr. Thomas M. Strouse), focusing on the biblical Baptists and their rejection of the scriptural errors that have dominated Protestant denominations and movements such as Fundamentalism. Pastor Stephen Hinebaugh will deal the pertinent topic "Why Study Baptist History?" Pastor Jon Stockton will discuss "Shifts in Protestant Worship and Doctrine" from a Baptist perspective. ### DEVOTIONAL CORNER

#### The Rock

"For who is God save the LORD? or who is a rock save our God?"

Psalm 18:31

We are taught in parable and precept of the rejection of Jesus Christ by his own people Israel. There is a parable in Mark 12:1-9. At the end of the parable the precept, "The stone which the builders refused is become

the head stone of the corner" (Psalm 118:22). Thus, the parable and the precept are linked together.

The Apostle Paul later wrote, "As it is written, Behold, I lay in Sion a stumblingstone and rock of offence: and whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed" (Romans 9:33). When he wrote to the Corinthians he clearly identified who the rock was, "...that Rock was Christ" (1 Cor.10:4).

The Apostle Peter wrote, associating Jesus Christ with Isaiah's prophecy (Isa.28:16). "Wherefore also it is contained in the scripture, Behold, I lay in Sion a chief corner stone, elect, precious: and he that believeth on him shall not be confounded. Unto you therefore which believe

he is precious: but unto them which be disobedient, the stone which the builders disallowed, the same is made the head of the corner, and a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offence, even to them which stumble at the word, being disobedient: whereunto also they were appointed" (1 Peter 2:6-8).

The significance of this for us is found in the words of the Psalmist: We find ourselves completely indebted to the Rock our LORD for saving us: "He only is my rock and my salvation; he is my defence; I shall not be greatly moved" (Psalm 62:2). For the deliverance from hell which we obtained and the future he gave us: "He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings" (Psalm 40:2). Then for a family relationship that he gave us: "Thou art my father, my God, and the rock of my salvation" (Psalm 89:26).

Jesus likened our salvation and life to that of "a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock" (Luke 6:48). A thousand years earlier the Psalmist expressed the same idea. "The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower" (Psalm 18:2). "O come, let us sing unto the LORD: let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation" (Psalm 95:1). -CAR
