

#### **BBTS SPRING 2025 LECTURE SERIES**

n the cold and snow-laden Friday, April 11, 2025, the Lord blessed with about ninety pastors and church members representing eleven area biblical assemblies in attendance for the lectures of Dr. Thomas M. Strouse and Dr. M. Ryan Strouse. The lectures were theologically rich, the fellowship was biblically enjoyable, and the luncheon physically satisfying. First, Dr. Strouse taught forcefully the promise of the perfectly preserved pure words of the LORD as ascertained by the sweet

psalmist of Israel in Psalm 12:6-7 and declared in the KJV and the Hebrew text behind the Bible. As he exegeted the whole psalm and interpreted the dilemma that David had to deal with was the attempted ouster from the everlasting Davidic kingdom promised by Jehovah through the inspired and preserved words that Nathan spoke (II Sam. 7:14-18). After all, his loved ones Absalom and Ahithophel conspired against David with hateful words demanding his dethronement and destruction (Prov. 18:2). David's only tangible encouragement was in the perfectly preserved pure words of divine promise!

The "sight-based" (II Cor. 5:7) opponents of the doctrine the perfect preservation of the pure words of Scripture argued against this biblical doctrine because of gender discordance ("words" [feminine] "them" [masculine]), and asserting that David taught the preservation of the "poor" and "needy" (v. 5), rejecting closest antecedent—words. These rationalistic opponents were named as Dr. Mark Ward, Dr. James White, and Dr. Dan Wallace, all of whom reject the fideistic approach to the Scriptures. Dr. Strouse responded with the problem of rejecting the nearest antecedent when gender discordance arises in Hebrew, citing gender discordance in Prov. 6:20-21 ("commandment" and "law" [both feminine] and "bind them" and "tie them" and "he that soweth discord" [all masculine plural]), but the obvious incongruity of suggesting the rejection of the nearest antecedent and going back to gender concordance of the masculine words of "false witness," "speaketh lies,"





Dr. Ryan Strouse had a superb exegesis on "The Bibliology of Solomon," showing the truth that David passed on his doctrine of perfect preservation of the pure words of Scripture to his son Solomon who in turn passed them on to his son Rehoboam. In addition, he exposed the "androcentric idol of certainty of Textual Criticism." The following is an excerpt.

#### THE IDOL OF CERTAINTY IN TEXT CRITICISM

#### Excerpt

aith in the perfect preservation of God's certain Words of Truth has been deemed an unsatisfactory response to text critics, who scoff at the naiveté of simple belief in the High, Lofty, Holy, Almighty God's ability to preserve His own Words (Rom.1:17; Heb.11:1). Hebrews 11:1 reveals, "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." Faith has its substantial foundation in the person of the

Lord Jesus Christ; furthermore, faith becomes a certainty about the promised hope given in Scripture.<sup>1</sup> This passage highlights the inextricable link between the certain Words of Truth and one's faith. Consequently, one must consider the specificity and certainty of the hope of individuals who build upon a text foundation that is constantly under renovation.

In contrast to faith in the perfect preservation of God's certain Word is the androcentric idol of certainty. How can man ever be satisfied that we have all the original and certain Words of God? Text criticism has been erected as the modern theological means to obtain the elusive idol of the certain original manuscripts since copies are "not inerrant." The elusive itch that needs twenty-nine revisions and counting to no avail! The psalmist declared that we resemble the idols we worship; Psalm 115:8 states, "They that make them are like unto them; so is every one that trusteth in them." The uncertain pursuers of God's Words resemble their uncertain means that are aghast to the life of faith. They desire certainty, but only breed uncertainty in the underlying texts and numerous translations.<sup>3</sup>

Daniel Wallace is a foremost textual critic who has established the ground rules for evangelical textual criticism training, which does not encourage faith built upon Scripture such as "my sheep hear my voice" (Jn.10:27). Notably, Wallace concludes that Christian beliefs are anchored in probabilities. He states, "So if we do not have absolute certainty about the wording of the original, what do we have? We have an overwhelming probability that the wording in our printed Bibles is pretty close." This is the uncertainty that produced Blaise Pascal's pragmatic wager: since we do not have certainty about God's

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> "Just the Gospel, please" is the subtle separation of Jesus Christ (the Word) from the Word by some in Evangelical circles. Scripture is replete with the person of Christ being inseparably linked to the Word. Of note, Revelation 19:11 reveals the return of our King who is called "Faithful and True" and "his name is called The Word of God." The whole counsel of God speaks of Jesus Christ and is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction, and righteous living like Christ (Acts 20:27, Lk.24:44, II Tim.3:16).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Similarly, the sight-based, 450 prophets of Baal that ate "at Jezebel's table" blatantly rejected the faithful provision of Jehovah. Their idolatry was mocked by Elijah "cry aloud: for he is a god; either he is talking, or he is pursuing, or he is in a journey, or peradventure he sleepeth, and must be awaked" (I Kgs.18:27). Contrariwise, Elijah stirred up the faith of God's people and said "come near unto me…" (I Kgs.18:30). Idolatry of any kind is a faith killer.

existence, it is better to seal up His eternal benefits through religion instead of the chance of eternal hell... just in case God actually does exist.

Furthermore, the "Wallace Dictum" is the foundational notion that a prioris<sup>5</sup> have no place in text critical efforts. Wallace states, "I would question whether it is an epistemologically sound principle to allow one's presuppositions to dictate his text-critical methodology. This is neither honest to a historical investigation nor helpful to our evangelical heritage." Elsewhere, Wallace states, "a theological a priori has no place in textual criticism."

For example, a theological *a priori* would be:

- 1. The assumption of the existence of a perfect written original text (Wallace betrays his own dictum in pursuit of "determining the exact wording of the autographs").
- 2. Theological Presuppositions based on verses in "errant" copies, such as Christ's *Thy word is truth*" (Jn.17:17) or "*Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled*" (Mt.5:18).
- 3. Theological deductions that the Almighty God of heaven who inspired His Words to man must then preserve His Words for mankind.
- 4. Or, if Jehovah has the power to hang the Sun, Moon, and stars then He also has the power to preserve copies of His original Words providentially and perfectly.<sup>8</sup>

The believer's faith is not based on evidentialism and rationalism such as Paul revealed in I Corinthians 1:22, 2:5, "For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom...that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." Our faith is based on the certain Words of Truth copied, translated, and dispersed by men under perfect providential preservation of Jehovah Himself (Ps.12:6-7).



<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> A priori (from the earlier) is knowledge can be obtained through reason alone based upon concrete math (1+1=2), deduction (x then y), tautology (husbands = married), and faith in the living God and His Word. Contrariwise, a posteriori (from the later) is a term that denotes to obtain knowledge one must use reason and evidential proof to verify something is true (scientific method).


